Together these two elements have allowed me to work closely with Helen Dunlop - Head of Education, Depute Head, Teachers and Learning Support Workers to examine best practices in learning and teaching and put them into every day classroom routines for the benefit of all young people in East Park. Our collective ambition is to embed a culture of high expectation in delivery of teaching and a sense of maximum achievement for all our learners. I am privileged to be part of the process.
